Upcoming Annual Appeal

That time of year again, where we humbly ask for your financial donations. It is only because of the generous support from all of you, that we are able provide the needed services and community events that enhance the lives of our older adults.

However you choose to support Helping Hands Outreach, know that your support is very important and appreciated.

Who Can Be a Caregiver?

The answer might surprise you. Anyone can be a <u>caregiver</u> and many are without even realizing it or classifying themselves as one. One in every 6 adults are <u>caregivers</u>, 59% are women, 24% are over 65, and 23% are providing care to someone with dementia.

A report conducted by the National Alliance for Caregiving (NAC) and AARP, found that <u>caregivers</u> are:

- •85 percent relatives
- •10 percent friends
- •3 percent neighbors
- •2 percent another non-relative

When a person requires care for those day-to-day tasks, most of the time, this care is provided by someone close to them, usually a relative.

Help for the <u>caregiver</u> can be found, and is often supplemented by, a hospice team, home health care, neighbors, hired nursing assists, and community support (like Helping Hands Outreach), however much of the physical and psychological stress still falls on the family <u>caregiver</u>. Due to the prolonged nature of <u>caregiving</u>, respite is very important. (RESPITE is the term used to offer relief or short term care services for the <u>caregiver</u> when they are absent or need a break.)

While the relative is usually the spouse or adult child of the care receiver, sometimes the <u>caregiver</u> isn't even old enough to manage their own legal or medical decisions.

According to the National Alliance for Caregiving, people in the U.S. between the ages of 8 and 18 care for over 1.3 million sick and/or disabled family members.

They perform a variety of tasks, with some of their responsibilities including:

- grocery/clothes shopping, cooking, cleaning, and laundry
- bathing, dressing, toileting, getting in/out of bed, on/off chairs, and feeding
- paying bills, and managing legal documents (advanced directive, power of attorney, will, trust, estate planning)
- making sure medications are taken correctly, manage behavioral symptoms and pain, supervise others who are assisting with cares/respite, and locate medical support systems.
